Cautions.

All numbers preceded by the letter 'A' are Automatic numbers; all other numbers relate to connections with the Manual (non-Automatic) system, and must not be dialled.

Before commencing to dial remove the receiver from the hook.

The dial must be operated with the finger. The use of a pencil or similar object in place of the finger causes mistakes in dialling and injures the dialling mechanism.

The dial, when rotated, must be permitted to return to its normal position without assistance, and nothing must be done to hasten or retard its action.

Do not make any extra movements of the receiver hook; simply allow it to come up when the weight of the receiver is taken off, and to go down with the weight of the receiver.

Do not move the hook or dial while talking, as this will disconnect the circuit.

If, in making a call, you should make any false movements of dial or hook, hold down the hook for a second or more, and begin

Be sure you have the right number in your mind, then lift the eiver, call the number correctly, and thus avoid annoying other

Always wait a reasonable time for an answer. Not all persons can answer every call immediately; consider the possibility of the place being closed or the usual occupant being temporarily absent. Answering your own bell promptly means better service.

If you have more than one call to make, be sure you disconnect after each by hanging up the receiver for a second, then remove receiver and commence dialling.

If, after dialling, you fail to get either the 'ringing' or the 'engaged' sound, or if you get a wrong number, make another careful attempt. If you are again unsuccessful in establishing a connection with the desired number, dial No. 5911 and report the fact. A specific report of a telephone fault will hasten its correction.

In using a party line or an extension telephone, listen and speak before operating the dial; otherwise you may interrupt another's conversation. A call will not be effective with two receivers off the hooks. After a connection is established the movements of another party's receiver hook or dial will not break the connection.

If, after a connection has been established, it is accidentally lost, it should be re-established by the pe on who made the call. The called party should replace the receiver on the hook and await the second call.

A Subscriber can test his own instrument and line, with reasonable certainty, by dialling his own number and listening for the engaged 'buzz.' If heard it indicates that the call has gone through properly, and his line is in order.

AUTOMATIC TELEPHONES.

A Subscriber having an Automatic Telephone must be beeve the following rules for obtaining a connection with another automatic telephone:—

For example :- To call A4851:

Remove the receiver from the hook.

Place a finger in the hole in the dial over the figure 4 and rotate the dial until the finger touches the finger-stop. Remove the finger and allow the dial to run back freely. Now place the finger in the hole over the figure 8 and rotate the dial again to the finger-stop, allowing it to rotate back. Do this in turn with 5 and 1. When the dial has returned on the last rotation your line is connected with line No. A4851, and the bell on that line begins ringing intermittently, as you can hear with the receiver at your ear.

If you hear a distinctive intermittent buzz, this indicates that the line you are calling is engaged. When you hear this, hang the receiver on the hook LARGE END DOWN, and call again in a reasonable time.

When finished talking hang the receiver on the hook; the connection is then broken, and your telephone is in a position to receive calls.

Should you wish to make a second call, return the receiver to the hook, or depress the hook for a full second in order to complete the disconnection, then commence dialling again.

To call any Subscriber not on the Automatic Section, dial 0. When the Exchange Attendant answers the call, give the number in the usual way.

DIRECTIONS FOR OPERATING MANUAL (NON-AUTOMATIC) TELEPHONES.

A Subscriber not equipped with an Automatic Telephone must call the Exchange in the usual way, and when the attendant answers, give the number required.

To report any difficulties or inaccuracy in your service, ask for 8104, Complaint Department.

SPECIAL NOTICES TO SUBSCRIBERS

Enquiries, Complaints, and Faults.

Subscribers are notified that enquiries about outside motters cannot be answered, and they should not converse with the attendant beyond giving necessary instructions. While promptness and sivility on the part of the attendants will be insisted upon, subscribers should also refrain from anything like rudeness of speech. In the event of complaints of inattention or rudeness, the Officer in Charge should at once be asked for.

If your Telephone Apparatus is out of order, dial A5911 if Automatic, and if Manual ask for No. 8104.

New Subscribers. Information.

New subscribers will be provided with a supply of cards to enable them to notify clients and friends of the fact that they have taken up a connection. When making enquiries respecting new numbers, ask for No. 8110.

Communications with other Exchanges.

Apart from the annual subscription, a separate charge is made for a conversation with another exchange or office. This is called a 'Toll Communication.'

Subscribers requiring Toll Communications should ask for and obtain 'Toll' before stating their requirements.

Directory Listings.

Subscribers must notify the local office in writing of any additions or alterations required in the Directory, not later than 9th July and 9th January in each year.

Removal of Telephones.

Subscribers are requested to communicate to the local office in writing any change needed in the situation of Telephone Apparatus.

Calling Subscribers.

Use great care in giving numbers to the Operator. Remember that if your request is misunderstood someone will be put to the inconvenience of unnecessarily answering the telephone, and you to

When giving a number, subscribers are requested to name each figure separately instead of running the figures into one number: thus, 'six-two-five' instead of 'six hundred and twenty-five.' If the number is tollowed by a letter, care should be taken to name the letter as well as the figures.

The word 'nought' should be used for the figure 0, and the word 'double' in conjunction with a figure to indicate its repetition, e.g., No. 1550 should be given as 'one double five nought.'

Be particularly careful in giving the numbers 'five' and 'mine'they are apt to sound take over the telephone.

When the conversation is finished see that the receiver is placed on the hook, and ring off.

Party Lines.

Subscribers desiring to communicate with party line Subscribers must advise the Exchange Attendant of the telephone number required and the letter following such number.

A party line Subscriber desiring to communicate with a Subscriber sharing his own line should do so independently of the Exchange. by using the special code rings corresponding with the letter following

the number of the wanted Subscriber. When the conversation is finished the receiver should be replaced on the hook and no 'ring off' should be given. The code rings corresponding with the different letters used are:—'A,' one short one long; 'D,' one long two short, 'J,' one short three long; 'K,' one long one short one long; 'M,' two long; 'R,' one short one long one short; 'S,' three short; 'U,' two short one long; 'W,' one short two long; 'X,' one long two short one long.

A short ring in the above cases is one complete revolution of the magneto handle; a long ring is three revolutions.

EXTRA MILEAGE CHARGES.

Individual lines: Per furlong or fraction thereof beyond the boundary of the

base-rate area, 10s. per annum.

Two-party lines: Per Station, per furlong or fraction thereof beyond the boundary of the base-rate area, 5s. per annum.

Three-party lines: Per Station, per furlong or fraction thereof beyond the

Four-party lines boundary of the base-rate area, 3s. 4d. per annum.

Per Station, per furlong or fraction thereof beyond the boundary of the base-rate area, 2s. 6d. per annum.

The minimum extra mileage charge is £3 per mile per annum.

RURAL LINES.

Rural line service for five to ten party is available for Subscribers outside the base-rate area. The minimum rate is £3 per station. The minimum mileage charge is £1 5s. per quarter mile of circuit.

PRIVATE TELEPHONE LINES.

Persons may construct their own lines to connect with the Departmental system.

JOINT USE OF TELEPHONE.

Any person occupying the same premises as a Subscriber may, upon payment of a small annual fee, arrange with the Subscriber for the joint use of his connection.

ILLEGAL OR IMPROPER USE OF TELEPHONE.

Telephone connections must not be used for improper or unlawful purposes, or for the purpose of conveying fictitious messages. Telephone messages must not contain language of an objectionable, obscene, or offensive nature, or of a character calculated to provoke a breach of the peace.

CHARGES FOR TOLL COMMUNICATIONS.

NOTE.—URGENT COMMUNICATIONS at ANY time are charged double the fees shown under the heading '8 a.m. to 9 p.m.' They take precedence of all others.

ORDINARY RATES

(Including Sundays and Holidays).

The charges for the use of toll lines are as follows:-From 8 a.m. to 9 p.m.,-Up to three minutes-For distances up to 20 miles For every additional 5 miles or fraction thereof up to .. 0 4 For every additional 10 miles or fraction thereof exceed-From 9 p.m. to midnight and from 6 a.m. to 8 a.m. at exchanges which are open at any time between those hours,-Up to three minutes,-For distances up to 40 miles ... For every additional 5 miles or fraction thereof up to 100 miles
For every additional 10 miles or fraction thereof exceed-From midnight to 6 a.m.,-Up to six minutes-For distances up to 40 miles For every additional 5 miles or fraction thereof up to 100 miles
For every additional 10 miles or fraction thereof exceeding 100 miles 0 1

For every additional minute exceeding 3 between 6 a.m. and midnight, and for every additional minute exceeding 6 between midnight and 6 a.m., the charge is one-third of the initial rate. All fractions of a penny are counted when calculating the charge for a communication, but fractions smaller than a halfpenny are disregarded in the total.

A charge as for one minute is made for unsuccessful calls, if the toll line has been used.

The delivery to a person outside a toll station of a message that such person is required to attend at the station is subject to a special fee. No message, except a request for attendance, may be delivered.

Toll accounts are payable on demand, and must be paid within seven days, otherwise toll privileges may be suspended.

TRANSMISSION OF TELEGRAMS BY TELEPHONE.

A Subscriber to a Telephone Exchange may, by applying to the Postmaster in writing, have his telegrams telephoned to or from his business or private address during the ordinary hours of the Telegraph Office. (For Charges see Postal Guide.)

Telegrams may be addressed to a Telephone Exchange Subscriber and telephoned to the addressee free of charge.




