The Government was informed by the person who paid William Jones's passage that he was 38 years of age. It appears that he is 47 - a great deal of doubt whether assistance would have been given at all if his actual age had been known. I have required him therefore to sign a promissory note for the balance £8.10.0 - having it to be paid as has been explained to him to determine whether or not it shall be collected - I suggest that if it is decided that assistance shall not be given to him he shall be required to pay the balance of the actual cost of the passage £14 instead of the nominal cost of £7. This will be £5.10 - instead of £8.10.0 -
