Stolen.

STOLEN during the evening of the 10th ult., from Leithfield, a bay mare, 5 years old, branded like on near shoulder, white star on forehead, the property of James Pokelly, of Leithfield.

About the end of December, 1870, was stolen from the Creek Station, Rangitata, the property of William Bush, a dark bay gelding, very quiet, aged, 14½ hands high, small star on forehead, branded TO on near shoulder, with a small round lump close to frog on near hind foot, the effect of staking.

During the passage of the s.s. Gothenburg from Dunedin to Wellington, a case the property of Wm. Brass, Christehurch, was broken open, and the following articles, all identifiable, abstracted:—Three drab clipper corsets, 10 yards drab silk velvet, 6 shepherd's plaid shawls.

Stoles, on the 14th ult., from the Ulster boarding house, Christchurch, a leather pocket book, containing thirty-six sovereigns, and three one pound notes, the property of Joseph Florance. An Italian named Frank Trovelier is suspected, described as 32 years of age, 5ft. 4in. in height, stout build, fresh complexion, black hair, whiskers and moustache; dresses in a brown cloth suit, a black cap with French peak. The suspected man, who is still in Christchurch, was searched but without success.

DURING the evening of the 14th ult., the dwelling-house of Elizabeth Mortimer, Ferry Road, was burglariously entered during the absence of the owner, and the following articles stolen:—An English silver lever watch, open face, white dial, steel hands, No. 5778, the letters W C scratched on the back; a colonial gold ring, set with six diamonds and four opals, one of the opals missing—both identifiable.

Stolen from the person of Henry Eagle, of Smithfield, near Temuka, while lying asleep during the night of the 1st ult., in the Royal Hotel, Temuka, two £10 notes of the Union Bank of Australia issue. Eagle had the money on his person when he went to sleep, after drinking heavily, and on waking in the morning, found that it had been stolen. John Curtis, suspected, description:—An Englishman, 25 years of age, 5ft. 6 or 7in. in height, fair hair and complexion, no whisker, beard, or moustache. Curtis resides in Temuka.

Stolen during the evening of the 7th ult., at Akaroa, from the person of Richard Berry, a silver lever hunting watch, the letters JB conjoined, scratched on the outside case. Berry was drinking with a number of strangers in an hotel when he discovered his loss. The watch is valued at £7

Stoles from the dwelling of Samuel Elstab, of Burnham, during the afternoon of the 15th ult., a five chambered revolver, electroplated mounting, discolored, curved stock made of dark-colored wood; 1 clasp knife, steel spring on the back of handle; 1 pair old boots; and 1 pair socks, marked S E in red worsted. Some travellers suspected.

Stolen from the dwelling of F. H. M. Walker, Esq., Leithfield, sometime in February or March last, three or four white single blankets, and one large double blanket with red selvedge all round—valued at £6. Some of the workmen at Mr. Walker's Flax Mills are suspected. A reward of £5 is offered for recovery of the goods, and conviction of the offender.

NOTICE OF FREE PARDON.

Colonial Secretary's Office. (Judicial Branch.) Wellington, 17th April, 1871.

Whereas a Fire, supposed to have been caused by the act of an incendiary, occurred on the morning of the 12th inst., on the farm of Mr. William Reid, in the Province of Canterbury, whereby two blocks of stacks were burnt. It is hereby notified that his Excellency the Governor will grant a Free Pardon to any accomplice in such act, not being a principal offender, who shall give such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the principal offender or offenders, or any of them, if more than one.

A Warrant has been issued by the Christchurch Bench for the arrest of Peter Goodwin, for neglecting to obey an order made
by the Resident Magistrate, to pay a sum of
ten shillings per week towards the support
of his illegitimate child. Description of
offender:—A native of County Mayo, Ireland, about 27 years of age, 5ft. 7in. high,
full face, dark complexion, dark beard,
whiskers, and moustache, walks lame with
his right leg, a labourer, generally dresses in
monkey jacket, moleskin trousers, watertight
boots, and Scotch cap, or felt hat.

CHARLES NEWMAN is charged on Warrant issued by the Caristchurch Bench, with failing to comply with an order made by the Bench, for the support of his wife and family. Description:—An Englishman, 36 years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, medium build, dark complexion, black hair and whiskers, full face, brown eyer, scar across upper lip, little finger of left hand contracted, dresses in dark tweed suit, and black felt hat, a labourer by trade. Warrant in Commissioner's office.

A Warrant has been issued by the Bench at Christchurch, for the arrest of Frederick Bowdler, charged with disobeying a summons for committing a breach of the peace. Description:—A Londoner, a sailor, 25 years of age, 5ft. Sin. high, stout build, dark complexion, dark brown hair, no hair worn on face, high cheek bones, carries his head a little forward when walking, dressed in dark monkey jacket, Bedford cord trousers, black felt hat, Crimean shirt, all nearly new, smart appearance, is very talkative, and frequents public houses. Warrant filed in Commissioner's office.

On the evening of the 14th ult., Charles H. Nielsen the mate, and George Webb a seaman, on board brigantine Ottawa, lying at Timaru, left the s.s. Beautiful Star to return to their vessel, both men had been drinking, and were very quarrelsome. The men did not return to their vessel, and next morning their boat was found two miles away, with Webb's hat, Neilsen's scarf, and a bottle of brandy in it. A portion of Webb's body has since been recovered. There were spots of blood on the gunwale of the boat when picked up, which leads to the belief that the men quarrelled and fell overboard together, or, that Neilseu murdered Webb, and left the locality immediately.

Joseph Cohen is charged on Warrant with the embezzlement of £20 from Reinhold Eckmann, at Melbourne, on the 11th March, 1871. He is a Clerk, aged 22 years, 5ft. 9 or 10in. high, slim build, dark complexion, dark hair, cut short, slight moustache, dark eyes, Jewish appearance, wore dark paget coat, dark trousers, and drab felt hat. Offender left Melbourne in the steamer Gothenburg, on the 18th March, for New Zealand, stowed away by the first steward.

DURING the night of the 18th ult., two hogsheads of beer, the property of R. Belgrave, Saxon Hotel, Lyttelton, which were left out of doors, were maliciously tapped and the whole of the beer lost.
