1. POLICE GAZETTE. - Communications for this GAZETTE should be addressed to the COM-MISSIONER OF POLICE, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. 2. STOLEN, during the night of the 17th ultimo, from a paddock in Stanmore Road, a canvas horse-cover, lined with black and red drugget, the property of W. D. Carruthers.

STOLEN, from an outhouse on the premises of Samuel Armitage, on the 19th ultimo, a canvas carpet-bag, containing a light blue flannel coat, a light tweed coat, a number of towels, three or four dark colour vests, one pair trousers (light colour), one ditto with stripe down the leg, women's underclothing (marked M. A.), one tablecloth with a patch on the corner. On the outside of the bag is painted the words "Wood, Esq."

STOLEN, from the barque Coronilla, lying in Port Lyttelton, an iron keg, containing 1 cwt. of pine coloured paint, with the words "pine colour" painted on the lid, in pink. It is supposed that some of the watermen plying to the ship have stolen it.

Two stacks of wheat, the property of Frank O'Brien, of Waimate, were, on the afternoon of the 12th July last, maliciously set on fire, and were destroyed.

INFORMATION is requested of James Patten, who left his home, Papanui Road, Christchurch, on the afternoon of Friday, the 16th June last, since when nothing has been heard of him by his friends; he is described as being fourteen years of age.

INQUIRIES are requested respecting Jane Robertson, who left her home on the Lincoln Road on the 30th June last, and has not since been heard of. Description: A native of Scotland, about nineteen years of age, but looks younger; medium height, thin build, dark complexion, dark brown hair, worn loose, small features, and delicate looking; was then dressed in scarlet jacket and grey linsey skirt, lace-up boots, not any hat or bonnet.

INQUIRY is requested respecting Grace M'Lean, a native of Tobodnarey, Scotland, who arrived in Dunedin six or seven years ago per ship Silistria; when last heard of was in service at Oamaru, which place she left about three years ago, it is supposed for Canterbury, to act as barmaid. She had a brother named Abraham, who is supposed to have died and left her some money.

INFORMATION is requested respecting Michael Horneck, described as being Irish, thirty-nine years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, dark hair and whiskers, dark complexion, sharp features, erect gait, swings one arm in walking, has a habit of smiling when talking, is bandy as a carpenter, and may pass as such. CHARLES W. Lawson is charged, on warrant, with having, about the 15th instant, embezzled a sum of £100 sterling, the proceeds of the sale of goods sold on account of his master, Richard Allen, by whom Lawson was employed as a hawker. Offender is supposed to have come to this province, and is described as being twenty-eight years of age, 5ft. Sin. or 9in. high, fair hair, blueish eyes (rather weak), fresh complexion, a native of Scotland, but had been a long time in London; by trade a draper; intelligent and respectable looking.

James Kirk is charged, on warant, with assaulting Grace Boden, at Barry's Reef, on the 25th August, with intent to commit a rape. He is a miner, aged about thirty or thirty-two years, 5ft. 10in. high, short dark hair, long black whiskers, beard, and moustache; may shave off the whiskers; awkward easy-going gait; wore black tweed trousers and coat, high crowned drab Yankee hat, no vest, Crimean shirt, red and black colour, and nearly always twirls his moustache when in conversation. Will probably quit the colony for New South Wales or New Zealand.
