#### Abstract

Note.-This Gazette contains the substance of Informations received in cases of Felony and of Misdemeanors and against Receivers of stolen goods, reputed Thieves and Offenders escaped from custody, with tho time, place, and circumstances of the Offence; the Names of persons known, but not in ctisfoty, who are charged with Offences, and descriptions of those who me not known, their appearance, dress, and other marlks of identity; the Names of Accomplices and Accessories, with every partienlar which may lead to their apprehension; a description, as accurate as possible, of property that has been stolen, and a minute description of stolen horses, \&c., for the purpose of tracing and recovering them.

1. Police Cazette.-Communivations for this Gazette should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in charge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police cvery instance of the non-delicery of the $G_{a z e r t e, ~ a i d ~ t o ~ s u g g e s t ~ f r o m ~ t i n z e ~ t o ~ t i n e ~ s u c h ~ a l t e r-~}^{\text {- }}$ ations in the addresses and in the mode of transmission as may be considered necessary.
2. Warrants.- Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is gicen, shail be apprehended, it should be stated in the adecrtisenent for the Gazette whether or not a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the Offemler. When a warrant has not been issued in the first instance, any subsequent report annowncing the issue of a warrant, should refor to it in the Police Gazette.
3. Namss.- It is particularly requested that in all Informations, the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legibly, the Christian name being given with the Surname, and written in full, to prevent mistakes.
4. Stray Catcue.-No advertisement of lost horses or cattle, will be published in this Gazvite untess they be Governinent property, but notices of horses or cattie believed to be stolen, will be inserted gratuitously.
5. Property Described.-The brands of horses and cattlo should be imitated as nearly as possible, und their earact position given. In descrihing watches, it
should be stated whether they are open-focel, Iumting, doulle-cused, or halj-Ginuting,-the term "double-cased" being reserved for those watches those vutcr case is remocal in order to wind! "half-hunting" implying a very smutl glass in the middlle of the dial.
6. Rewards.-No revards must be aceepted by the Alembers of the Force without the sanction of the Commissioner of Police. Whon such clevins are made, a full report of the circumstaces must accompany the application They willinot be allowed, cxapt in cases where meritorious actions showing uausual ability take place, or when they have beens sanctioned ly Legislative cmactanent.
7. Previous Rheerexces.- It is requested that in all reports respecting cases alrcady guzelled, Offecrs in charge of Police, or others concerned, will he good enough to quote tho date and pagn of the Ponce Gaznitre in which the preious notice has appeared, and, in reporting arrestz, to stale by thoin effected. Supplencenturg reports of cases already reporied, but not gazetled, should contain such injorvation as will clearly identify the case.
8. Telegrabs.-Tn telegrams, the use of figures must be avoiiled, aidl worda at fiell length selhstituted. In Jorrterding the Lrands of horses and cattlo por telegiaph, it should be stated of what kind of Ictlers, the brants consist, whether of Romans capilals, or ia writing, \&o.

## Stolen.

Sores time between the 29th December, 1S68, nud 10th Jannary, 1869, the dwelling of Thomas Appleyard and Willian Keig, situate in Chester street cast, Christchurch, was entered, and the following articles stolen therefrom :-One $£ 20$, two. E 5 , and one $£ 10$ notes; banks and numbers unkuown; one gold nugget breast pin, with a few speeks of quartz in it ; one sill watch guard ; one silver pencil case; bloodstore seal, T.W. in Italian letters engraved thereon; one light cheek silk searf; one hair gold mounted Albert, repaired with pealing wax; oue gold nugget with hole in it ; one Euglish gold breast pin; some book markers; a trausfer of lease of section 303; one meerschaum pipe, having the amber mouth-piece broken; a small loaking-glass; ono flowered white silk bandkerchief, marked II. $A$. in red ink; one large square mufler, black and white; one small silver pencil-case, marked with MI on slide, and three white shirts.

Stolen from outside the shop of Edward George, High street, Christchurch, on the 213t ultimo, one pair of lady's boots, size, six, elastic sides, and single soles.

Stoves, from the person of James Donoghue, whilst in a state of intoxication, at the Ashburton, on the 9 th ultimo, one pocket-book with elastic band, lined with blue inside, the initials J.D. marked on the paper within; one cheque for £S 9d., which cannot be described, but is supposed to be drawn by Mr. Greenstreet, on the Union Bank of Australia, and about twenty shillings in silver. A man who was in company with Donoghue is suspected. Description:-About 5 feet 10 inches bigh, between 50 and 60 years of age, grey hair and whiskers, left eye very bloodshot, medium build, dissipated appearance, dressed in ordinary working clothes.

Stoles, from the premises of John Comer on the 12th ultimo, whilst out drying, two blue striped shirts, one white shirt, marked J.C., one print skirt, marked J., one jacket, one chemiso, one pair of drawers, three children's flannel petticoats, one inside flannel, three small white shirts, one white frock with insertion up the front, one whito petticoat, three children's print frocks, two Holland pinafores, one worked round with crochet-work, and the other with scarlet Berlin wool, three diaper pinafores with worked bands, two white bonnets, one quilted white hat, two large white pocket-handkerchiefs, one diaper towel, two Holland jackete, with pockets, bound round with tho feather stitch.

Stolen, during the night of the 24th ultimo, from the farm of Mr. M. Carter, Seadown, Leithfield, about six chains of ordinary fencing wire, and eighteen wooder straining posts, $3 \times 4$, and five feet long.

## Inquests,

Treers was an Inquest held at Kriapoi on the 5th ultimo, before Charles Dudley, Esq., Coroner, on the body of the infant child of Georgo Dawsons. Verdict -Died from natural causes.

Treane was an inquest held at Christchurch, on the Gth ultimo, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Arthur Hopper, aged 30. VerdictAccidentally drowned.

An Inquest was held at the Sisters, Pleasant Point, Timaru, on the 20th ultimo, before B. Woollcombe, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Arthur Neate, aged 18 years. Verdict - "That deceased shot himself with bis right hand, while in a state of temporary insanity.

An Inquest was held at Christchurch, on the 25th ultimo, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Thomas Cook Martin, aged 27 years. Verdict, "Committed suicide while in a state of temporary insanity.

As Inquest was held at Akaroa, on the 25th ultimo, before John Watson, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Mary Jane Phillips, aged 2 years. Verdict, " Accidently scalded by being knocked into a saucepan of boiling water by a boy named W. Watkins, which resulted in her death.

Geobge Wate, is charged on Warrant issued by the bench at Timaru, with obtaining money from Edward Stephen Dunford, of Saltwater Creek, by means of a valueless cheque. Description:-A Scotchman, 24 years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, fair baic, sandy whiskers beard and moustache, beard scanty, medium build, chin short and broad, high cheek bones; wore dark grey tweed coat and trowsers, black wideawake; dirty slovenly appearance; a labourer.
