Note.—This Gazette contains the substance of Informations received in cases of Felony and Misdemeanors, and against Receivers of Stolen Goods, reputed Thieves and Offenders escaped from Custody, with the time, place, and circumstances of the Offence; the Names of Persons known, but not in custody, who are charged with Offences, and Descriptions of those who are not known, their appearance, dress, and other marks of identity; the Names of Accomplices and Accessories, with every particular which may lead to their apprehension; a description, as accurate as possible, of Property that has been Stolen, and a minute description of Stolen Horses, &c., for the purpose of tracing and recovering them.

- 1. Police Crazette.—Communications for this Gazette should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in charge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police every instance of the non-delivery of the Gazette, and to suggest from time to time such alterations in the addresses and in the mode of transmission as may be considered necessary.
- 2. WARRANTS.—Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is given, shall be apprehended, it should be stated in the advertisement for the GAZETTE whether or not a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the Offender. When a warrant has not been issued in the first instance, any subsequent report announcing the issue of a warrant, should refer to it in the Police GAZETTE.
- 3. Names.—It is particularly requested that in all Informations, the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legibly, the Christian name being given with the Surname, and written in full, to prevent mistakes.
- 4. Stray Cattle.—No advertisement of lost horses or cattle will be published in this Gazette, unless they be Government property, but notices of horses or cattle believed to be stolen, will be inserted gratuitously.

5. PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—The brands of horses and cattle should be imitated as nearly as possible, and their exact position given. In describing watches, it should be stated whether they are open-faced, hunting, double-cased, or half-hunting,—the term "double-cased" being reserved for those watches whose outer case is removed in order to wind; "half-hunting" implying a very small glass in the middle of the dial.

#### Stolen.

Stolen from the hut of Charles Edwards, Cambler Station, South Track, on the 11th ultimo, two £1 notes, two Crimean shirts, the first red striped on a white ground, the buttons newly sewn on with strong thread; the second a blueish grey shirt, new, the buttons newly sewn on with strong thread; the right wristband is also sewn with the same kind of thread; a black billy-cock hat, with small crown and narrow leaf; a buck horn handle knife, blade four inches long, rounded at the point.

Stoles at the Kaiapoi Bar, between the 7th and 14th ultimo, the property of John Petersen, a new fishing net, 30 yards long, made of No. 10 tailors' cotton, James' line, with the lead rolled inside the calico; at one end of the net there are new corks, sewn on with cotton; at the other end the line is woven through the corks.

STOLEN from Thomas Denton, at the Greta Peak Station, on the 24th November, 1869, a silver lever lunting watch, white dial, nearly new, 'maker's name, "Coates, Christchurch, No. 4794," had a small piece of leather attached.

Stolen from William Smithson, Ferry Road, Christchurch, on the 10th ultime, a large colonial made saddle, with large knee pads, a piece worm off the left side of pommel, one girth strap broken off on off side; two white girths, nearly new, plain stirrups.

#### Inquests.

An Inquest was held on the 3rd and 10th ultimo, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of a newly born female child, which was found in the River Avon, close to the residence of G, Bowron, on the East Town Belt. Verdict:—Found dead.

Ax Inquest was held at Woodend, on the 11th ultimo, before Charles Dudley, E-q, Coroner, on the body of William Mckenzie, aged 14 months. Verdiet:—Accidentally drowned.

An Inquest was held at Christchurch, on the 18th ultimo, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Edward Hamilton, aged 51 years. Verdict:—Suicide, while in a state of temporary insanity.

As Inquest was held at the Opihi, on the 20th ultimo, before B. Woolcombe, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Meti, a Maori, aged 19 years. Verdict:—Accidentally drowned,

An Inquest was held at Kaiapoi, on the 25th ultimo, before Charles Dudley, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Eugene Paul Morton, aged 14 years. Verdict:—Accidentally drowned.

A WARRANT has been issued by the Bench at Timaru, for the apprehension of Francis John Wilson, for escaping from the legal custody of William Butterworth, bailiff to the Resident Magistrate's Court, Timaru. Description: 35 years of age, five feet nine inches high, stout build, dark brown hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache; round shouldered, short neck; when walking carries his head over his right shoulder. A native of the Cape.

A slab building at Okain's bay, containing about half-a-ton of potatoes and a few old tools, the property of J. Thacker, was destroyed by fire at about 10 p m. on the 6th ultimo, supposed to be the act of an incendiary.

#### A PROCLAMATION.

Whereas by "The Stamp Duties Acts Amendment Act, 1869," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation, to proclaim and bring into operation the said Act, or from time to time any parts thereof, at such time as the Governor shall think fit:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the Thirtieth day of September, 1869, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the Second day of October, 1869, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, did proclaim and bring into operation the whole of the said Act, and did fix the first day of January, 1870, as the day upon which the said Act should come into operation:

And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted that the term "receipt or discharge for or on payment of any sum of money of the amount of five pounds or upwards," where used or referred to in the first Schedule to "The Stamp Duties Act, 1866," and in "The Stamp Duties Act Amendment Act, 1867," shall with reference to all instruments made after such day as the Governor shall appoint, be taken to mean and include any note, memorandum, or writing whatsoever given to any person for or upon the payment of money, whereby any sum of money, debt, or demand, or any part of any debt or demand therein specified and amounting to five pounds or upwards, shall be expressed or acknowledged to have been paid, settled, balanced, or otherwise discharged and satisfied, or which shall import or signify any such acknowledgment, and whether the same shall or shall not be signed with the name of any person:

And whereas it is expedient to fix a day for the purposes of the said recited enactment:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in excreise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby appoint and fix the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, to be the day mentioned in the said recited enactment, so that the said term "receipt or discharge for or on payment of any sum of money of the amount of five pounds or upwards," shall, with reference to all instruments made after the said thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, have such meaning, and include such notes, memoranda, and writings, as in the said recited enactment provided.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, and issued under the seal of the said Colony, this fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.
