Note.—This Gazette contains the substance of Informations received in cases of Felony and Misdemeanors, and against Receivers of Stolen Goods, reputed Thieves and Offenders escaped from Custody, with the time, place, and circumstances of the Offence; the Names of Persons known, but not in custody, who are charged with Offences, and Descriptions of those who are not known, their appearance, dress, and other marks of identity; the Names of Accomplices and Accessories, with every particular which may lead to their apprehension; a description, as accurate as possible, of Property that has been Stolen, and a minute description of Stolen Horses, &c., for the purpose of tracing and recovering them.

- 1. Police Gazette.—Communications for this Gazette should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in charge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police every instance of the non-delivery of the Gazette, and to suggest from time to time such alterations in the addresses and in the mode of transmission as may be considered necessary.
- 2. Warrants.—Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is given, shall be apprehended, it should be stated in the advertisement for the Gazette whether or not a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the Offender. When a warrant has not been issued in the first instance, any subsequent report announcing the issue of a warrant, should refer to it in the Police Gazette.
- 3. Names.—It is particularly requested that in all Informations, the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legibly, the Christian name being given with the Surname, and written in full, to prevent mistakes.
- 4. Stuax Cattle.—No advertisement of lost horses or cattle will be published in this Gazette, unless they be Government property, but notices of horses or cattle believed to be stolen, will be inserted gratuitously.
 - 5. PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—The brands of horses and cattle should be imitated as nearly as possible, and

- their exact position given. In describing watches, it should be stated whether they are open-faced, hunting, double-cased, or half-hunting,—the term "double-cased" being reserved for those watches whose outer case is removed in order to wind; "half-hunting" implying a very small glass in the middle of the dial.
- G. Rewards.—No rewards must be accepted by the Members of the Force without the sanction of the Commissioner of Police. When such claims are made, a full report of the circumstances must accompany the application. They will not be allowed, except in cases where meritorious actions showing unusual ability take place, or when they have been sanctioned by Legislative enactment.
- 7. PREVIOUS REFERENCES.—It is requested that in all reports respecting cases already guzetted, Officers in charge of Police, or others concerned, will be good enough to quote the date and page of the POLICE GAZETTE in which the previous notice has appeared, and, in reporting arrests, to state by whom effected. Supplementary reports of cases already reported, but not gazetted, should contain such information as will clearly identify the case.
- S. Telegrams.—In telegrams, the use of figures must be avoided, and words at full length substituted. In forwarding the brands of horses and cattle per telegraph, it should be stated of what kind of letters the brands consist, whether of Roman capitals, or in writing, &c.

Stolen.

Stolen, on 5th ultimo, from the residence of Jane Ballanger, Windmill Road, Christehurch, a cotton velvet jacket bound with black tape and worked with black beads on the front and arms. Identifiable, A neighbour named Mitchell suspected.

Stolen, on the night of the 14th ultimo, from the premises of Theodore Dethier, Cashel street, a ladder about 17 feet long; deal sides and stringy-bark steps. Identifiable.

Stoles from Avonside Church, during the night of the 15th ultimo, an American clock, 12 x 7 inches, with gable top and house painted on the door. Identifiable.

Stolen from the dressing room, Theatre Royal, Christchurch, on the 16th ultimo, £25 in gold, the property of Cassy Matthews, an actress, who, while performing on the stage, left her skirt hanging up in the dressing room with £30 in gold in her purse in the pocket; on returning to the room, £25 was missing. Doubtful case.

Inquests.

An Inquest was held on the body of Patrick Egan, at Lincoln, on the 1st ultimo, by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner. Verdiet—Death from heart disease.

As Inquest was held at the River Styx, on the 4th ultimo, by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Jane Lowe. Verdiet—Death from heart disease.

An Inquest was held at the Sand Hills, on the North Road, by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the 5th ultimo, on the body of Bridget Jones, aged 18 months, who met with her death on the 3rd ultimo by burning. Verdict—Accidental death.

An Inquest was held at Kaiapoi, on the 18th ultimo, by Chas Dudley, Esq., Coroner, on the body of George Crawford Black. Verdict—Death from apoplexy.

An Inquest was held by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, at Lake Ellesmere, on the 23rd ultimo, on the body of Mary Rebecca Tanner, aged 3 years, who, on the 21st ultimo, met with her death by scalding. Verdict—Accidental death.

An Inquest was held, at the Mount White Crossing of the Waimakariri, by J. D. Enys, Esq., J.P., on the 25th ultimo, on the body of Patrick Markey, who met with his death while crossing the River Waimakariri when in a flooded state. Verdiet—Accidentally drowned.

An Inquest was held at the Weka Pass, on the 26th ultimo, by M. Morris, Esq., District Coroner, on the body of Samuel Elleren, who died of consumption. Verdict—Death from natural causes.

Missing Friends.

ENQUIRIES are requested respecting JOSEPH JAMES LORNS, who emigrated from Gravesend on the 5th July, 1856, in the ship "Joseph Fletcher," for Canterbury, New Zealand. Description—About 5 feet 8 inches high, rather stout, dark complexion, 35 years of age. Last heard of in August, 1868, at Pleasant Point, near Timaru. Had a contract with the Canterbury Government to take the mails up country in 1864 or 1865.

Description of James O'Brien—An Trishman, a laborer, 37 years of age, 5 feat 9 inches high, medium build, dark complexion, brown eyes, dark-brown hair worn long, dark-brown bushy whiskers, beard, and moustache; dressed in blue cloth monkey jacket, moleskin trowers, water-tight boots, and black billycock hat; general appearance is that of a laborer. Information to Commissioner of Police, Christchurch. He has a brother in Williamstown, a sister in Launceston, Tasmania, and a brother in Dunedin.

WILLIAM WILLIS and JOHN WEBB left Christ-church on the 7th February, 1870, going southwards. Two men, exactly answering their description, left Dunford's Accommodation House, on the North Bank of the Rakaia, on the morning of the Sth instant. Later on the same morning, a swag was picked up which, with its contents, has since been identified as that of Willis's. Search and enquiry has been made for them, but, up to the present, without success. Description: WILLIAM WILLIS—19 years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, stout build, fair complexion, hair, and whiskers; sharp features, blue eyes, a little stooped when walking, blind in one eye, but it is not noticeable to others; dressed, when last seen, in dark tweed sac coat, dark-brown vest, dark tweed trousers, elastic-side boots, drab wideawake hat; wore an English silver lever watch, face cracked, leather guard, gold bar attached. John Webs: 27 years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, slight build, fair complexion, hair, whiskers, and moustache; nose pock-pitted, carried his head stooped whilst walking; dressed in light sac coat, dark tweed vest, worsted cord trousers, brown billy-cock hat, wore black and white searf, water-tight boots, a cut up centre of right boot.—It is thought probable that the above men may have gone towards West Coast, viá Rakaia Gorge.

MICHAEL GARTHING is charged on warrant, from Westland, with obtaining £5 8s. 6d. by false pretences from Cullen Bros., of Hokitika. Description—An Irishman, a miner, 24 years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, light hair, no whiskers, very little moustache, high and broad check bones, stout build, wears light coat, dark trousers with light stripes,

light billy-cock hat, Wellington boots. Supposed to have gone to the Nelson Province, $vi\hat{a}$ Greymouth. He was one of a party of miners on Blake's Terrace, Waimea.
