1. Polres Gazette. - Comanaications for this Gazette should be addreszed to the Compussionien or Poltce, prepaid: they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in clarge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police every instance of the non-delicery of the Gazette, and to suggest from time to time such allerations in the adhresses and in the mode of transmission us may be consilered necessnry.
2. Warpants.- Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is given, shall be apprehended, it should be stated in the advertisemeat for the Gazerte whether or not a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the Offender. When a tearrant has nol bcen issued in the first instance, axy subsequent report announcing the issue of a varrant, should refer to it in the Police Gazette.
3. Nayes - It is particularly requested that in all Informations, the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legilly, the Chrsstica newa being given with the Surname, and written in full, to precent mistakes.
4. Stray Cattre.-No adcertisement of lost horses or cattle will be published in this Gazerte, unless they be Government property, but notices of horsces or cattle believed to be stolen, will be inserted gratuitously.
5. Property Descmibed.-The brands of harses and callle should be initated as nearly as possible, and
their exact position given. In describiag vatches, it should be stated whether they are open-firsed, hunting, double-cased, or hal/-huating,-the term " double-cased" being reserved for those watches those outer case is renoced in order to wind; "helf-henting" inplying a very small glass in the midllle of the dial.
6. Rewirds.-No reacurls must be accepted by the Mlembers of the Furce without the sasction of the Commissioner of Police. When such clorims are made, a full report of the circumstances must accompany the application. They vill not be allowed, except in cases thiere mevitorious actions shewing unuswel ability take place, or when thay have been sanctioned by Legislative enactineat.
7. Paevious Referexces.-It is requested that in all reports respecting cases alicady gazetted, Officers in charge of W'olice, or others concerned, will be good enough to quote the date and page of the PoLter Gazette in which the previous notice kas napeared, and, in weporting arrests, to state by whom elfected. Supplementary reports of cases already reporied, but not guzeltcul, should conteia such information as will clearly identify the case.
8. Teldgrams.-In telegrams, the use of figures nust be acoided, and words at fikl length substituted. In fortarding the brands of horses and cattle per telegraph, il should be stoted of that kind of letters the brands consist, whether of Roman capitals, or in writing, \&o.

## Stolen.

## Inquests.

As Inquest was held at Christelurch on the 2nd ult., by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Cororer, on the body of Agnes Emma Roach, an infint, ayed 3 montlas, who met with her death by suffocation, through having swallowed a piece of ribbon. Verdict-Accidental death.

Inquests were held on the 20th April and the 3rd ultimo, at Christchurch, by J. W. S. Coward, Esq, Coroner, as to the origin of the fire which took place on the 5th April in Colombo street, by which the buildings in the occupation of Mcssrs. Brownell, Withey, and Hill were destroyed. Verdict-"There was no evidence to show how the fire originated."

Ax Inquest was held at Christchureh on the 21th ult., by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Mary Tobin, nged 5 years, who died on the 22nd ult, of diptheria. Verdict-Natural causes.

Ax Inquest was held at Kiniapoi on the 30th ultimo, before Charles Dudley, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Darid TV. Turner, master of the ketch "Folly," who was drowned on the 27 th ult., by the capsizing of the vessel when taking the Waimakariri bar. Deceased was a native of St. Joln's, Newfoundland. Verdict-Accidentally drowned.

An Tnquest was held at Kaiapoi on the 2 sth ultimo, by C. Dudley, Esiq, Coroner, on the body of Robert Campbell, a seaman on board the ketch "Folly," who met with his death on the 27 th ult., under the same circumstances as the foregoing. VerdictAccidentally drowned.

## Missing Friends.

Infomanton is requested respecting a persob named Hamnam, supposed to be in New Zealand, following the occupation of a butcher.

Esputriss are requested respecting the whercabouts and circumstances of one James Watkin, an Englishman, 25 years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, stout build, fair complexion and fair hair, sandy whiskers; dressed in dark tweed coat, moleskin trousers, billycock hat, and watertights. Watkin left Napier, leaving his wife behind, about the beginning of February. Letters are lying for him in the Post Office, Christchurch.

Tirs house of Miss M. A. Candy, Montreal street, Christchureh, was broken into between $6.30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$., and 9.30 p.m., on the 27 th ultimo, during the absence of the owner and her scrvant, the only inmates; and £25-consisting of two Bank of New Zealand £5 notes, and fifteen £1 notes on various banks, numbers in neither case known-stolen from her purse, which was placed in the pocket of a dress hanging up. A quantity of jewellery and plate was in the house, and two cheques and some silver in the purse, but ail left untouched. From subsequent enquiries made by the Police there is very strong suspicion against Mary Taylor, the servant, who still holds her situation. Description--22 years of age, mediun height, fair complexion, stout build, brown hair, ent short, biue eyes, broad face. None of the stolen property can be identified.

George Lago is chargel (on warrant) with obtaining by means of false pretences, the sum of $£ 318 \mathrm{~s}$. from Darid Middleton, storekeeper, at tho Rakaia. Description-English, 50 years of age, height 5 feet 5 or 6 inches, stout build, red face, grey hair and whiskers, no monstache, dressed in dark tweed suit and white dress hat; a pianoforte tuner ; very fond of drink, feequents hotels, well educated and very loquacious ; supposed to be in Duncdin.

A stack of whent, valued at $£ 100$, the property of Messrs. Bruce and Coe, Irwell, was on the evening of the 30th April maliciously set fire to and completcly destroyed. Suspicion attached to no one in particular.
