NOTE.—This GAZETTE contains the substance of Informations received in cases of Felony and Misdemeanors, and against Receivers of Stolen Goods, reputed Thieves and Offenders escaped from Custody, with the time, place, and circumstances of the Offence; the Names of Persons known, but not in custody, who are charged with Offences, and Descriptions of those who are not known, their appearance, dress, and other marks of identity; the Names of Accomplices and Accessories, with every particular which may lead to their apprehension; a description, as accurate as possible, of Property that has been Stolen, and a minute description of Stolen Horses, &c., for the purpose of tracing and recovering them.

1. POLICE GAZETTE.—Communications for this GAZETTE should be addressed to the COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in charge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police every instance of the non-delivery of the GAZETTE, and to suggest from time to time such alterations in the addresses and in the mode of transmission as may be considered necessary.

2. WARRANTS.—Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is given, shall be apprehended, it should be stated in the advertisement for the GAZETTE whether or not a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the Offender. When a warrant has not been issued in the first instance, any subsequent report announcing the issue of a warrant, should refer to it in the POLICE GAZETTE.

3. NAMES.—It is particularly requested that in all Informations, the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legibly, the Christian name being given with the Surname, and written in full, to prevent mistakes.

4. STRAY CATTLE.—No advertisement of lost horses or cattle will be published in this GAZETTE, unless they be Government property, but notices of horses or cattle believed to be stolen, will be inserted gratuitously.

5. PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—The brands of horses and cattle should be imitated as nearly as possible, and their exact position given. In describing watches, it

should be stated whether they are open-faced, hunting, double-cased, or half-hunting,—the term "double-cased" being reserved for those watches whose outer case is removed in order to wind; "half-hunting" implying a very small glass in the middle of the dial.

6. REWARDS.—No rewards must be accepted by the Members of the Force without the sanction of the Commissioner of Police. When such claims are made, a full report of the circumstances must accompany the application. They will not be allowed, except in cases where meritorious actions showing unusual ability take place, or when they have been sanctioned by Legislative enactment.

7. PREVIOUS REFERENCES.—It is requested that in all reports respecting cases already gazetted, Officers in charge of Police, or others concerned, will be good enough to quote the date and page of the POLICE GAZETTE in which the previous notice has appeared, and, in reporting arrests, to state by whom effected. Supplementary reports of cases already reported, but not gazetted, should contain such information as will clearly identify the case.

8. TELEGRAMS.—In telegrams, the use of figures must be avoided, and words at full length substituted. In forwarding the brands of horses and cattle per telegraph, it should be stated of what kind of letters the brands consist, whether of Roman capitals, or in writing, &c.

Stolen.

STOLEN from the Store of Messrs. Cobb and Sawtell, at noon on the 26th ultimo, two new corn sacks, since recovered. A man of the following description was seen making away with the property, and on being called by the Storeman he dropped the bags and made off. About 45 years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, stout build, dark hair and whiskers, wore a dark coat and cap.

STOLEN, on the night of the 29th ultimo, from John Nevin, at the George and Dragon Hotel, Templeton, a pair of watertight boots, slightly worn. Two men who slept in the Hotel on the night in question are suspected. Descriptions given.—First man: about 30 years, 5ft. 5in. high, stout build, dark complexion, dark hair and moustache; dressed in moleskin trousers, old black coat, and dirty felt hat. Second man: about 30 years, 5ft. 9in. high, stout build, dark complexion, black hair and moustache; dressed in moleskin trousers, old black coat, and dirty white felt hat. The lost property can be identified, as also the suspected men.

Inquests.

AN Inquest was held at the Woods Station, McKenzie Country, on the 17th of August, 1870, on the body of James Helling, aged 55 years, by T. A. Clowes, Esq., Coroner. Verdict—Injuries received through a fall from a horse.

ON the 8th ultimo an inquest was held at Killinchy, Leeston District, before W. B. C. Christy, Esq. Coroner, on the body of Mary Isabella Allen, a child of 1 year and 9 months, who met with her death through having eaten the heads of several lucifer matches. Verdict—Accidental poisoning.

AN Inquest was held at the Glentanner Run, McKenzie Country, on the 8th September, 1870, on the body of John Brown, aged 26. Verdict—Found dead.

AN Inquest was held at the Ashley River on the 10th ultimo, by M. Morris, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Patrick Croskilly, aged 29 years. Verdict—Accidental drowning.

AN Inquest was held at the Orari on the 12th ultimo, by B. Woolcombe, Esq., Coroner, on the body of William Stranks, aged 42 years. Verdict—Died from disease of the heart.

AN Inquest was held at Templeton on the 14th ultimo, by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of James Innes, aged 28 years. Verdict—Accidental death.

AN Inquest was held at the Waitoi Flat on the 26th ultimo, on the body of Elizabeth Akroyd, aged 39. Verdict—Natural causes.

AN Inquest was held at Christchurch on the 27th ultimo, by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of an unbaptised illegitimate male child of William Nobbs and Elizabeth Ellen. Verdict—Natural causes.

AN Inquest was held at Parcora Flat, Timaru District, by B. Woolcombe, Esq., Coroner, on the 28th ultimo, on the body of James Bell, aged 60, a farmer, who died on the 26th of disease of the lungs. Verdict accordingly.

MURDER.

£ 1 0 0 R E W A R D .

WHEREAS information is before me that on the 1st day of October instant, Thomas Higginbotham was murdered at the General Hospital at Launceston by some person or persons unknown. Now I hereby give notice that I am authorised by his Excellency the Governor to offer a reward of Fifty Pounds in addition to a sum of Fifty Pounds guaranteed by the Municipal Council of Launceston, making in all One Hundred Pounds, to any person or persons who will give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the said murderer or murderers, and in case such person is a Colonial

prisoner, he shall, in addition to such reward, be entitled to a Free Pardon; and in case of his being an Imperial prisoner, be recommended to her Majesty's mercy for a Conditional Pardon.

A warrant has been issued for the arrest of Thomas Heuson, per Lady Franklyn, charged with the above offence. Description:—57 years old, 5ft. 5in. high, swarthy complexion, light hair and whiskers, the latter said to have been shaved off, blue eyes, large features, a piece bitten off the end of nose, scar on top of forehead, small scar back of right hand and on left cheek bone, native place County Carlow, Ireland; wore dark coat with light one underneath, dirty moleskin or corduroy trousers, and either a black billycock or deerstalker hat; was employed as wardman at the Hospital, Launceston, from 1862 to 1868.

A WARRANT has been issued by the Bench at Christchurch for the apprehension of John Downie, for disobeying a summons for a violent assault. He is an Irishman, aged 30, 5ft. 6in. high, medium build, fair complexion, light brown hair, sandy beard, whiskers, and moustache, grey eyes, round face, thin sharp nose, dressed in drab tweed suit, red necktie, and dark felt hat; a miller by trade.

DESERTED from the ship Monarch, on the 2nd, 4th, and 9th October, 1870, whilst lying at Port Lyttelton, the persons described below. Philip Andrews: a Scotchman, 22 years of age, dark complexion, 5ft. 7in. high, dark hair and whiskers. Henry Swanson: an Irishman, 22 years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, slight build, effeminate voice, tuft of beard on chin. John Collins: 24 years of age, an Englishman, short, stout build, round shoulders, fresh complexion, full face; brown hair, whiskers, and moustache. Daniel Sayle: 30 years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, very dark complexion, spotted on face, tuft of beard on chin, moustache, a native of the Isle of Man. — McKenzie: a Scotchman, about 5ft. 6in. high, dark complexion, slight whiskers and moustache, dark hair. — Fulton: aged 24, 5ft. 6in. high, slight build, thin face, an

Irishman, wears a cap with broad top. Henry Rennie: aged 29, tall, thin build, dark complexion, tattooed on both arms and rings on the middle fingers of right hand, bullet scar above the ankle on left leg, beard and moustache close. William Freeman: aged 22, looks very young, little hair on face, walks with a slight stoop. Robert Lundy: aged 24, a big man, with red moustache, and tuft of beard on chin, an Irishman, walks very slovenly in a stooping rolling gait. Walter Martin: aged 23, medium height, walks with a stoop, swings his arms in a peculiar manner, wore moustache and tuft. John Condin: aged 30, an Irishman, moustache and beard cut short, light grey eyes. Edmund Fagg: aged 34, 5ft. 6in. high, red hair worn long, moustache, and tuft of beard on chin, hooked nose, a peculiar expression about the eyes, a rolling gait. Fulton returned, and Freeman has been arrested; the rest are still at large.

JOHN SMITH and Joseph Miller are charged on Warrant issued by the Timaru Bench with absenting themselves from the hired service of the New Zealand Meat Preserving Company, Washdyke, Timaru. Smith is a Scotchman, aged 23, 5ft. 6in. high, fresh complexion, roman nose, dark hair, smooth face, medium build, dresses well, wears a Scotch cap, a tinsmith by trade. Miller is a Scotchman, aged 24, 5ft. 7in. or 5in. high, fair complexion, fair hair, beard beginning to grow, large roman nose, stout build, round shoulders, inclined to look downwards, dresses well, wears a Scotch cap, a tinsmith. Both these men are supposed to have gone to Dunedin to endeavour to get away to Victoria.

BETWEEN the hours of 1 and 2 o'clock on the morning of the 16th ultimo, the house of Wm. Preece at Addington was feloniously entered by breaking a pane of glass in one of the windows and undoing the fastening. Mr. Preece, on hearing the noise, got out of bed, when the burglar made off. No property missing.
