GUNSHOT WOUNDS LED TO DEATHS

TIMARU, To-day. Inquests into the deaths of two employees of the firm of Dalgety and New Zealand Loan, Ltd., at Timaru on August 16 were completed before the District Coroner (Mr E. G. Bradley) yesterday.

He found that Frank Shields, aged 52, a merchandise traveller, died on August 16 at Centennial Park, Timaru, from cerebral lacerations, having committed suicide as a result of a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head.

The Coroner found that Kevin Russell Denley, aged 21, had died on the same date from cerebral lacerations after being accidentally shot in the head by Trevor John McKeever at the premises of Dalgety and New Zealand Loan, Ltd.

'On Friendly Terms'
Leo Asher Faigan, a pathologist at Timaru Public Hospital, said that he had performed an autopsy on the body of Denley. He handed his report to Mr Bradley.

Rex Victor McPhail, manager in charge of the merchandise department at Dalgety and New Zealand Loan, Ltd., Timaru, said that both McKeever and Denley had been working together for twelve months.

"To the best of my knowledge the two young men were on friendly terms and there was never any sign of animosity between them," said McPhail.

A statement by McKeever was read to the Court by Detective G. W. Golding.

The youth had a good home and good parents, and he had brought shame on them, said the Magistrate.

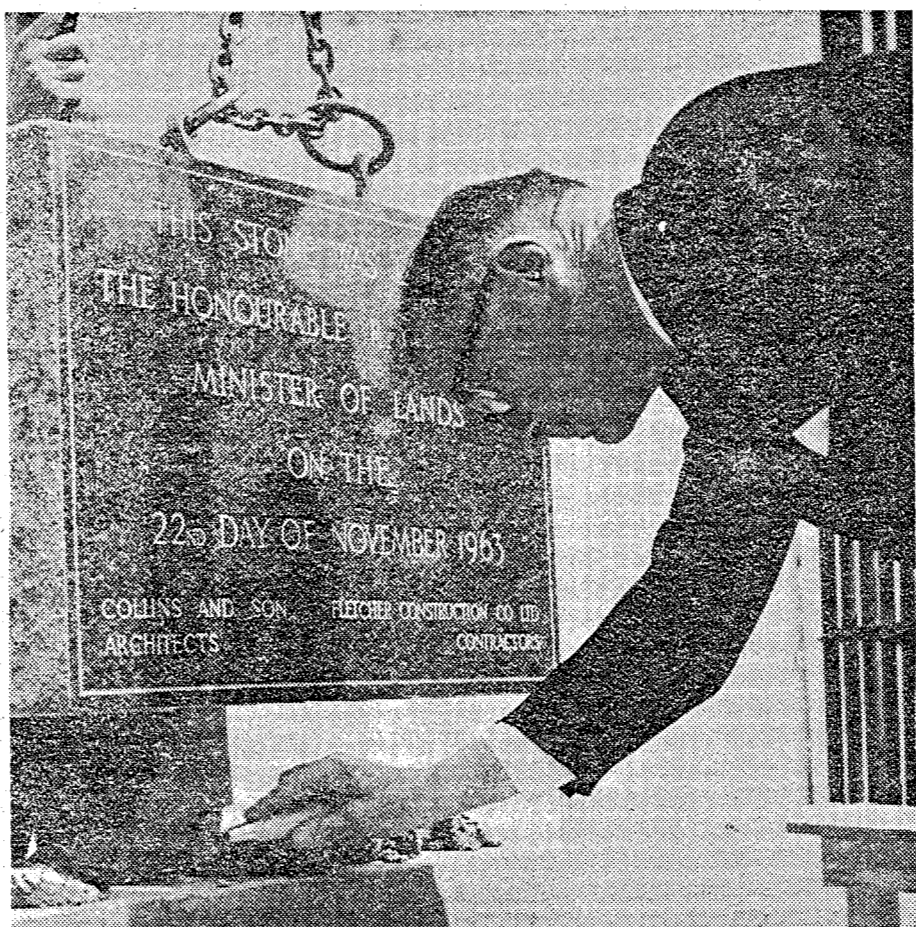
Has to Change

NEW POST OFFICE 'IS WORTHY OF TOWN'

ASHBURTON, To-day.

IN the new £104,000 Post Office, Ashburton had a building worthy of the growing size and importance of the town, Ministerial and local dignitaries said at the dedication of the foundation stone yesterday afternoon.

The Member of Parliament for Ashburton and Minister of Lands (the Hon R. G. Gerard) laid the stone at a simple function after speeches marking the event had been given.

Borough, county, and local body representatives were among the official party.

About 450 people heard speeches outlining the growth of the town in the past 105 years and referring to efforts during the past twenty-five years to have the Post Office extended or replaced.

The Mayor (Mr J. Davidson) while expressing pleasure at the new Post Office, added: "The only thing we want now is to have this area declared a chief postal district."

Mr Davidson said that for many years the community had struggled with a building too small and not suited to its modern purpose.

He recalled that the first Post Office was in the first building erected in the town. He believed the new building would be a fitting replacement and be a tribute to the work of the pioneers.

He thanked the Postmaster General (the Hon A. E. Kinsella) and Mr Gerard for their efforts in obtaining the new building.

Mr K. C. Cooper, president of the Ashburton Rotary Club, termed the building a milestone in the history of Ashburton.

Ashburton was growing rapidly in construction, farm production, and the next thing which must come would be industry.

The country chairman (Mr R. E. Buick) added his thanks to the authorities for providing the new Post Office.

Before formally laying the foundation stone, Mr Gerard recalled the 60-year life of the recently demolished buildings.

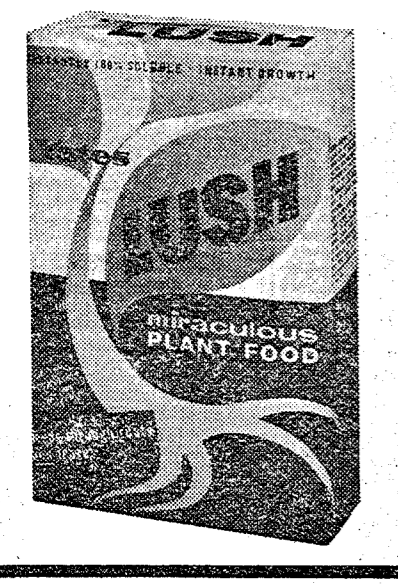
