

### ARRESTED ON DAY OF RELEASE

He had been released from prison yesterday morning, and had been arrested later in the day. Peter John Joseph Turner told Messrs F. E. Olds and H. F. Butland, Justices of the Peace, in the Magistrate's Court today.

Turner was remanded in custody until November 29 on a charge of obtaining six toy dolls, valued at £3 10s, by false pretences on November 22.

#### Willful Damage

Michael James Russell, a 21-year-old motor assembler, had put his fist through the window of a van in Manchester Street about 1.40 this morning, Detective Sergeant A. G. I. Rodgers told the Court.

Russell who pleaded guilty to a charge of willful damage to the value of £6 was fined £5, and ordered to pay the £6 cost of damage. Charged with the theft of a bicycle valued at £5, Robert Kirk Prince was remanded to November 29.

Bail of £50, with one surety of £50 was allowed, and he was ordered to report daily to the police.

Lillian Rose Sheehan was remanded to Monday on a charge of being idle and disorderly on November 22, in that she had insufficient lawful means of support.

THE New Zealand athletic team is to be given a special fitness test just before going overseas.

This was decided last night by the New Zealand Amateur Athletic Association's annual meeting after hearing a "frank and full" discussion on the physical condition of representatives of the association who had gone overseas.

The subject was introduced by national athletics selector Mr J. Borland, who, before moving that the discussion be taken in committee, said that he was also speaking on behalf of the association's executive, Mr C. J. Thompson.

Jackman) issued a statement to the effect that the national association endorsed the remarks of selectors and other people concerning the physical fitness of the association's national representatives to go overseas.





Fast bowler R. C. Motz could not sustain his early hostility, but ended with a total of four wickets to his credit. He was the most successful bowler for Dowling's eleven.

Promoted to opening batsman in the second innings, B. F. Hastings scored 51 and K. Thomson contributed a sound 38 not out.


