



**H**E Council desires to direct the attention of the Public to the work the Society has inaugurated ; also to the liability it has incurred consequent on having to erect a Building for its operations, there not being one suitable in Christchurch.

The object aimed at by the Society may be stated to be the General Cultivation and Encouragement of Art in the District and Colony. This can be effected in no other way than by means of Annual Exhibitions ; by offering Medals and Prizes for Competition ; by distributing Works of Art through Art Unions ; and by forming a Choice Collection of Works of Art, together with a Library of Art Literature.

The advance already made in these directions, the Council trusts, is sufficient guarantee for future possibilities ; but with the existing debt, unless a liberal response is made to this appeal, the usefulness of the Society must be checked for a time. Donations, and an increase in the number of our Annual Subscribers, are therefore earnestly requested.
